OUR SCHOOL

Shanghai French School, Lycée Français de Shanghai is a non-denominational, coeducational day school serving students from kindergarten to high school. 70 students will graduate this year. The school hosts 1,450 students at two campuses: one in Qingpu and one in Pudong.

ACCREDITATION

Shanghai French school is a private institution run by parents organised as a board of directors. The school has a convention with the Agency for French Teaching Abroad and the French Ministry of Education.

The curriculum taught at the school abides by French legislation and national programs. In Shanghai we offer the same basic baccalaureate as in France. Drawing on the strength of the students who have benefited from a rich language environment, language sections have been created and validated by the French Ministry of Education.

THE SCHOOL FACULTY

FRENCH EDUCATION SYSTEM

The secondary school system is divided into two parts:

middle SCHOOL

30 to 35 hours of class on a weekly basis In year 10, all students are required to sit for an exam, the "Brevet", a French diploma (ongoing assessment as well as a final written exam in French, History-Geography and Mathematics)

high SCHOOL

37 to 40 hours of class on a weekly basis. In year 12/13, high school students sit for the "Baccalaureate" a French national exam where all exams are taken on the same day all over the world.



The Lycée Français de Shanghai was founded in 1996. The Eurocampus of Shanghai was founded in 2003 with an international community of teachers, staff and students. Our teachers come from France, China, Germany, Spain, the US, Canada and the UK. They are thus able to give an international outlook to our 1,450 students.

FRENCH BACCALAUREATE

The French Baccalaureate is not to be confused with the IB program, also known as the Geneva Baccalaureate, a private non-national exam offered by a selection of International schools.

Year 12 and 13 of the French Secondary education (Premiere and Terminale), students choose to specialize in one of the following academic sections.

- L: Language Arts
- ES: Economics and Social Sciences
- S: Math and Science

In addition to their required specialized courses, all high school students must enroll in English, History and Geography, Philosophy and Second foreign language.

The Baccalaureate exam starts in year 12 with French literature (oral and written) and a Personal Research Project (TPE).

In year 13 students take six to eight exams according to their chosen stream.

The Baccalaureate examinations are developed at the French national level, with the same examinations given all over the world at the end of year 12 and 13. Students must achieve a combined average score of 10 out 20 in order to pass.

OIBA (Option International Baccalaureat Americain / International American Baccalaureate option):

OIB FRENCH BACCALAUREATE

- Year 10 and 11 students prepare the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) in English language A and English literature.
- Year 13: In addition to the French Baccalaureate students take written and oral exams in English literature, History/Geography, and in English.

OIBC (Option International Baccalaureat Chinois / International Chinese Baccalaureate Option):

• In addition to written exams in each of the subjects studied for the French baccalaureate, students take written and oral exams in Chinese literature and in Mathematics in Chinese.

GRADING SYSTEM

The French School of Shanghai uses the French grading scale, ranging from 0 to 20:

- Report cards are issued at the end of each term (December, March and June)
- For high school students, report cards are translated into English. No GPA is calculated
- Ranking in the French system is difficult and rarely implemented

Over the past five years, the success rate on the baccalaureate examination at the French School of Shanghai has consistently averaged 100% with last year 93% of the students receiving honour scores.

Worldwide, 48% of students in the French system achieve honour level.
