Agenda 3: Operational Indicators of the QP Bus Service	No questions were raised	Addition: The goal of the school is to achieve a punctuality rate of 99% Addition: Overall audit points to reach are 100 points Addition: Shanghai Expo (CIIE) in November was one main reason for a delay in the bus service
Agenda 4: Incidents Reported by Bus Assistants	<ol> <li>What can we do to reduce the number of incidents in the 5e/6e?         ANS: A more intensified follow-up with the kids and the parents will be prepared.</li> <li>How often does the LFS report the incidents?         ANS: On a weekly basis the Vie Scolaire is getting the report, and they are discussing the incidents with the kid.</li> <li>Do the students know that the parents will get informed about bad behavior in the bus?         ANS: they get the information in the bus training that parents will be informed.</li> <li>What can the school do in addition to avoid the incidents?         ANS: The bus assistants could be stricter.</li> </ol>	Addition: One major issue is the unfastened seatbelts; so, there is a focus on it (drivers are not allowed to start the bus in case the seatbelts are not fastened Addition: we suspect that Bus assistants are not reporting all minor incidents currently (because there are a lot of incidents and it is not manageable) Addition: Within the last five years only one student got a permanent exclusion from the bus (this is unusual)

Agenda 6: Training on Safety & Behaviour – For Students	<ol> <li>Feedback to training for primary school in LFS: It is too complicated for the younger students – Can the material be updated together with the primary school? Also, a movie should be included.         ANS: Yes, this will be taken into account for the next training.</li> <li>Some bus assistants are too strict and are not allowing coats on the bus for younger kids. Can this be changed?         ANS: We will discuss it with the bus assistants during the next training.</li> <li>Some bus assistants cannot deal with parents' complaints, especially in the morning. How can we support them?</li> </ol>	



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	ANS: The bus manager supports the bus	
	assistants in communication with the parents.	
Agenda 7: Continues improvement	<ol> <li>Often the cars are coming out of the entrance of the parking lot – Is this allowed?         ANS: It is not allowed there is a "no exit" sign. We will improve the situation by extending the entrance of the parking lot. We also will train the security guards to have a closer look at this situation.</li> <li>Scooters are parked on the pedestrian way and they are blocking people who cross the street.         ANS: nobody is allowed to park in this position, and since last week, the security guard has been advising strictly.</li> </ol>	Addition: Parents were also asked to volunteer for the support of the security in the morning and the afternoon within the pick-up and drop-off area Addition:  The schools asked the traffic police to check and to suggest some improvements because there was an accident with a student and a car. The road markings have been repainted in few days. Other ideas will need to be explored in the next meeting with local authorities.
Agenda 8: Q&A	<ol> <li>Bus 44 and bus 46, issues between DSS and LFS students; also general notice that no one is allowed to adjust the seats at the back of the bus, as doing so disturbs the students seated there.</li> <li>Bus 22 and bus 44: Students are eating and the bus assistants are not reporting it</li> <li>Bus 24 and bus 44, students leave bag packs on seats and blocking seats for other students</li> <li>Bus 49: Bus assistants gave students something to eat</li> <li>Is somebody monitoring the pedestrian/cross-walk next to the kindergarten?         <ul> <li>ANS: Yes, staff from LFS.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Are there the same rules for LFS and DSS?         <ul> <li>ANS: Yes</li> </ul> </li> </ol>	Addition: It is allowed to use the smartphone, but not disturb other students or to take pictures of others Addition: We always should focus on the fact that buses should leave the school as soon as possible as some buses need more than one hour for one way.  Addition: We initially attempted to allow parents to accompany children under the age of 3 on school buses. However, according to laws and regulations, parents are not permitted to ride on school buses. As a result, children under 3 can no longer use the school bus service.
